Martin Luther encourages us to start each day new, as a clean slate, in the name of the Father Son and the Holy Spirit, remembering that we have been baptized and made clean through Christ's death and resurrection. Now that I think I can handle, day by day.

"Every action is inextricably dependent upon the one that preceded it, like some infinite dance that continues out in perpetuity until one of the partners exits the floor," *Unsaid*, by Neil Abramson, p. 13. The Missional Discovery Journey (MDJ) is a program by the South-Central Synod of Wisconsin, ELCA and its New and Renewing Evangelizing Congregations Mission Table. The MDJ is an eighteen month program designed to engage pastors and lay leaders in the Spirit-led development of a missional vision and practice for their congregations.

Being missional means continually asking the question, "Where is God leading us?" Missional means to be focused outward. It is to recognize God's mission to bless and heal the world. God has a purpose for us and we are here to discover what that purpose is in our neighborhood and community. Being missional means continually asking the question, "Where is God leading us?"


THE END IS NEAR!
